

The Kidney Transplant Program in the University of British Columbia Division of Nephrology seeks candidates for a full time position as a transplant nephrologist at a Clinical Associate Professor or Clinical Professor position. Expertise is required in the specific area of evaluating and managing kidney transplant patients. Applicants must have an M.D. or MD./Ph.D degree and should be certified in Internal Medicine and Nephrology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Applicants must be eligible to be licensed and in good standing with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia. Applicants should be middle or senior career nephrologists with at least 10-15 years of clinical experience in nephrology and transplantation. Applicants should have significant clinical research experience (preferably in the field of quality improvement).

Clinical responsibilities may include providing clinical care at St. Paul's Hospital and Vancouver General Hospital for patients in both the inpatient and outpatient services as a transplant nephrologist. Research or scholarship responsibilities may include developing and/or maintaining a research program in clinical science related to transplantation.

Applicants will assume a role as a clinician, teacher and clinical or translational scientist with a research program focused in an area related to renal transplantation. We seek candidates who embrace and reflect diversity in the broadest sense.
