<p>*Project Results</p>	<p><u>Mortality Review Collaborative</u> 31 March 2019</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Over 100 cases reviewed by a physician/nurse team with opportunities for improvement documented in the SLS database. Total of 19 different physicians participated in the reviews. List is attached. 14 monthly review discussion meetings (chart club) held. Quarterly reporting of progress/findings to the PHC Board Quality Committee.
<p>*Unexpected Outcomes</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ICU and Psychiatry groups have requested adapting the mortality review methodology to their areas in order to facilitate an improved quality of care process. VCH has joined the Collaborative and look to SPH for expertise. Island and Fraser Health Authority have attended chart club and are considering joining the collaborative. SPH is a leader of Innovative QI. (Not really an unexpected outcome)
<p>*Lessons Learned</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are opportunities to improve the frequency and quality of Goals of Care conversations at SPH. Pain control at end of life can be improved. (earlier palliative care involvement) Earlier recognition of the deteriorating patient is another opportunity for improving the quality of care provided to our patients at SPH. Board Quality Committee report and Low Hanging Fruit report attached.
<p>*Recommendations for improvement (to inform future projects and strategic decision-making)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Develop a communication plan at the beginning of a project in order to have broader involvement of medical, nursing and allied health staff. We need a better reminder system for physicians to complete reviews in a timely way. Strongly recommend continued support of this initiative.

This is \$1075.63 over the allotted amount. This variance is as a result of physician engagement in the activities and is a positive result. Physician Co-Chairs meet monthly to prepare for chart club, summarize findings and review the progress of the initiative. Approximately 56 hours of donated time.
